

Additional Business Assistance Research

Liquor License Fee – The Village budgets \$175,000 for liquor license fee revenue.

- Fee per business depends on the type of business.
 - Range from \$260 – \$1660.
- Liquor license fees for restaurants only = \$97,350.

Business License Fees - The Village budgets \$230,000 for business license revenue, with \$4,000 in late penalties.

- 1,318 businesses paying a fee in 2021 for a business license.
 - Estimated 2,934 business establishments exist in Orland Park (source: ZoomProspector by GISPlanning)
- Fee per business depends on the type and/or size of the establishment.
 - Can range from \$30 – \$1125.
- Restaurant yearly license fee = \$75 - \$1125 depending on size
 - They also pay a \$90 inspection fee per inspection, and the number of required inspections is dependent on the food establishment risk category, which is based on food handling procedures and the population being served.
- Business License Breakdown
 - General
 - 1032 total businesses
 - \$137,685 total fees
 - Food Category I – highest risk: full-service restaurants, grocery stores, nursing home, etc.
 - 121 total businesses
 - \$65,690 total fees
 - 3 inspections @ \$90 each
 - Food Category II – fast food/casual restaurants, etc.
 - 98 total businesses
 - \$33,695 total fees
 - 2 inspections @ \$90 each
 - Food Category III - Pre-package, etc.
 - 23 total businesses
 - \$6,685 total fees
 - 1 inspection @ \$90 each
 - Other: Massage, auto filling station, country club, temporary, bowling, advertising sales
 - 44 total businesses
 - \$17,170 total fees

Crime Free Housing Tri-Annual Inspection Fee and Annual Registration Fee – The Village is budgeting \$78,400 for crime free housing revenue in 2021.

- The Village collects two fees associated with rental properties:
 - \$50 annual fee to have a registered property (all properties each year)
 - Waiving or reducing this would ensure all property owners receive the same benefit.
 - Tri-Annual Rental Inspection Fees (not including re-inspection fees & fines):
 - Single Family Dwelling - \$150 (previously \$75)
 - Duplex - \$200 (previously \$100)
 - Apartment Building - \$200 + \$50 each individual unit more than two (2) units (previously \$100 + \$25...).
 - Waiving or reducing this would only benefit ~1/3 of property owners (any inspection due in 2021). Properties that paid the full inspection fee in 2019 and 2020 would not receive an equal benefit. In order for the benefit to be equally distributed, the Village would extend the same fee waiver through 2022. The Village will still need to conduct the tri-annual inspection.
- Rental Housing Program: 946 licenses with 2,548 units
 - Single Family Dwelling (Single Home, Condo, Townhome) – 721 Units
 - Inspection time estimate = 2 hours, 40 minutes
 - Duplex/2 Unit Apartment – 8 Units
 - Inspection time estimate = 3 hours
 - 3 or 4 Unit Apartment (Most are 4 units with an owner occupied unit) – 86 units
 - Inspection time estimate = 3 hours
 - 5 or 6 Unit Apartment (Most are 6 units with an owner occupied unit) – 98 units
 - Inspection time estimate = 3 hours, 30 minutes
 - 8 Unit Apartment – 3
 - Inspection time estimate = 3 hours, 45 minutes
 - 11 or 12 Unit Apartment (Most are 12 units with an owner occupied unit) – 23
 - Inspection time estimate = 4 hours
 - 27 Unit Apartment (Building behind Coopers Hawk) – 1
 - Inspection time estimate = 5 hours, 30 minutes
 - 80 Unit Apartment (Thomas Place) - 1
 - 18 hours
 - 42 Unit Apartment (Orland Crossing) – 4 (total of 160 Units)
 - Inspection time estimate = 50 hours for Orland Crossing
 - 295 Unit Apartment (9750) – 1
 - Inspection time estimate = 66 hours for 9750
