

Healy Initiative #1

I noticed some discrepancies in the gaming license information which may further investigation and reporting.

In January 2025, the number of gaming licenses was reduced to 25. A review of the gaming revenue produced by the IL Gaming Board notes 25 licenses generating revenue.

On May 5, 2025, a motion was put forward to lower the licenses to 24. This motion was tabled due to the inauguration activities.

The motion was never re-introduced.

25 licensees generated revenue in May and continued over the summer.

At the October 20, 2025, board meeting, a motion was made and approved to authorize 23 licenses.

Not sure if this was one less than the May motion or meant to reduce the number authorized from 25 to 23.

The November 2025 IL Gaming Board monthly report for November shows revenue from 24 licensees. (This is one more than authorized.)

On Tuesday, an email was sent out notifying us of a motion to decrease the gaming licenses to 22.

Questions:

1. As of October 20, 2025, there were only 23 licenses. How come there was revenue from 24 licensees?
 - a. It appears that at least one establishment has been operating without a license in November and most likely December 2025 and January 2026.
 - b. If there is a problem, **does the Village have to report a violation to the IL Gaming Board?**
 - c. If the previous liquor commissioner issued a revocation, did it ever take effect?
2. **How come the motion to reduce the number of licenses in May was never brought back to the board?**
3. **Can you please identify what licenses were revoked (or meant to be revoked) at the January 2025, May 2025, and October 2025 meetings?**
4. I seem to recall discussion (perhaps in private session in early 2025) regarding revocation of the gaming license for the Irish Patriot.
 - a. **Can you provide all documentation during 2024, 2025 and 2026 regarding the Irish Patriot matters relating to their gaming and liquor license?**
 - i. Documents should include emails, text messages, memos, police reports, meeting notes, revocation notices, reinstatement notices, fines, disciplinary notices, etc.
 - ii. If the documents are too voluminous, I can always run over at a convenient time to review.
5. **Can I please have a list of all active gaming licenses and liquor licenses?**
6. **If the gaming commissioner revokes a license, does there need to be board approval before it is official?**
7. **Why don't we note the licensee whose license is being revoked in our Board packets?**
