SECTION 5: INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE: The CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold harmless the VILLAGE, its trustees, officers, directors, agents, employees and representatives and assigns, from lawsuits, actions, costs (including attorneys' fees), claims or liability of any character, incurred due to the alleged negligence of the CONTRACTOR, brought because of any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons or property on account of any act or omission, neglect or misconduct of said CONTRACTOR, its officers, agents and/or employees arising out of, or in performance of any of the provisions of the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, including any claims or amounts recovered for any infringements of patent, trademark or copyright; or from any claims or amounts arising or recovered under the "Worker's Compensation Act" or any other law, ordinance, order or decree. In connection with any such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities, the VILLAGE, its trustees, officers, directors, agents, employees, representatives and their assigns shall have the right to defense counsel of their choice. The CONTRACTOR shall be solely liable for all costs of such defense and for all expenses, fees, judgments, settlements and all other costs arising out of such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities.

The Contractor shall not make any settlement or compromise of a lawsuit or claim, or fail to pursue any available avenue of appeal of any adverse judgment, without the approval of the Village and any other indemnified party. The Village or any other indemnified party, in its or their sole discretion, shall have the option of being represented by its or their own counsel. If this option is exercised, then the Contractor shall promptly reimburse the Village or other indemnified party, upon written demand, for any expenses, including but not limited to court costs, reasonable attorneys' and witnesses' fees and other expenses of litigation incurred by the Village or other indemnified party in connection therewith.

The indemnification obligation under this paragraph shall not be limited in any way by any limitations on the amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable by or for the benefit of Subcontractor or any indemnities under any Worker's Compensation Act, Occupational Disease Act, Disability Benefits Act, or any other employee benefits act. The Subcontractor further agrees to waive any and all liability limitations based upon the Worker's Compensation Act court interpretations or otherwise.

Execution of this Contract by the VILLAGE is contingent upon receipt of Insurance Certificates provided by the CONTRACTOR in compliance with the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

SECTION 6: COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, statutes, rules and regulations including but not limited to the Illinois Human Rights Act as follows: CONTRACTOR hereby agrees that this contract shall be performed in compliance with all requirements of the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et

Coffee shop to be first retail tenant in upscale apartment building

Giovanna Rendina O'Malley says her late father lived life to the fullest, and "he taught us that if you work hard, you can achieve whatever dreams you had."

A dream she and her mother, Maureen, had to open a coffee shop was put on the back burner after the recession hit. But sometime in March, when the first apartments in Orland Park's Ninety 7 Fifty on the Park building are ready for tenants, their Amano Vivere Cafe should be open for business.


Serving coffee, tea, smoothies and baked goods, the cafe will be on the ground floor of the building, which continues to take shape northwest of the intersection of 143rd Street and Ravinia Avenue.

Facing the 143rd Street Metra train station, the cafe will cater to commuters as well as residents of the apartment building, said Rendina O'Malley, of Palos Park.

"For the first few months it will be pretty much all commuter traffic" until more tenants move into the apartment building, she said. "We knew we had to be by a train station."

About 80 units at Ninety 7 Fifty will be ready for occupancy toward the end of March, with more being finished every two or three weeks after that, Christopher Kirles, a vice president with Flaherty & Collins, the project's developer, said. By the end of September, if everything goes according to schedule, all 295 units will be completed.

So far, 18 leases have been signed, with a mix of tenants including young professionals and empty-neaters, he said. Since the project's preview office opened in late October to visitors, more than

140 people have stopped by inquiring about apartments, Kirles said. There's also a website, www.ninety 7fifty.com, promoting the project.

At the office, located in a portion of the former Orland Plaza, visitors can help themselves to tubes of lip balm with the Ninety 7 Fifty development logo on them, or take home pouches of coffee that will be served at Amano Vivere. There's also a computer-generated, three-dimensional, video "walk-through" of the apartment building.

Kirles said Flaherty & Collins hadn't set a target of how many leases it hoped to have in hand at this point.

"There is no magic number by any means," Kirles said. "We are very happy with the demand. October to March is not a great time for the spartment market."

As work progresses on the building, that "continues to stir more and more activity and interest," he said.

Model to be ready soon

Kirles said that, by the middle of next month, a fully furnished, one-bedroom model apartment

will be ready for potential tenants to inspect. Monthly rents range from a bit more than \$1,300 for a one-bedroom up to \$2,400 for the 14 two-level units that will be part of the project, he said.

In early February, much of what remains of the Orland Plaza, with the exception of the Marquette Bank building at the east end of the property, will be demolished, Kirles said. A trailer will be set up to handle leasing for the apartments, he said.

Ultimately, the Marquette Bank also will be razed. The bank will relocate to a new branch office it is building at the southeast corner of LaGrange Road and 148rd Street.

While Ninety 7 Fifty on the park is the centerpiece of Orland Park's "Main Street" redevelopment, it occupies 3.5 acres of the 20-acre site, which officials want to see developed as a pedestrian-friendly mix of shops and other businesses.

Along with the coffee shop, Kirles said there is still another 2,800 square feet on the ground floor of the apartment building that will be available for retail uses.







MADE WITH LOVE

Amano Vivere Cafe brings homemade treats, gathering spot to Orland

In any business, there is simply getting it done, and there is doing it right.

Orland Park's Amano Vivere Cafe opts for the latter, arguably setting the standard for local businesses in the area, mere months after its opening.


Amano Vivere is an organic coffee and tea shop that capitalized in June on the benefits of both ground-level space inside Orland's blooming Ninety7Fifty on the Park development near 143rd Street and LaGrange Road - the cafe's official address is 9750 Crescent Park Circle, Suite A — and its proximity to Metra's 143rd Street station. Banking that commuters will translate to big business for the coffee shop, the cafe also opens a kiosk right at the station from 5:30-8 a.m. on weekdays.

"The location is ideal," co-owner Giovanna O'Malley said, noting she and her mother, Maureen Rendina, looked at several spots before settling on Orland after hearing about the development.

But for the co-owners, the good business practices of Amano Vivere run much deeper than just its location, and its success really starts with the food.

The cafe gets its coffee beans from a family in Wisconsin in an effort to work with people who share the cafe's interests in fair trade products and sustainability. It costs more, but O'Malley - who previously worked as a corporate paralegal - said she would not have it any other way, noting the products increase the quality of the cafe's coffee, espresso, cappuccino and lattes, as well as help ensure decent wages for people who produce the beans worldwide.

"Working in the workplace, you learn from corporate how not to

treat people," she said.

When it comes to the food which runs the gamut from bread loaves' and cookie bars to muffins and oatmeal - everything but the bagels are made in-house by O'Malley and her mother. The menu changes daily and often features a selection of gluten-free items designed to accommodate Rendina's gluten intolerance.

The duo also finds different ways to create many of the cafe's baked goods, often using fresh fruit in place of added sugar and butter.

"To me, it's healthier and it tastes better," O'Malley said.

And so far, O'Malley said she isn't getting many complaints. One customer even declared it "much better than Starbucks" during our visit. And a trio of favorites are already emerging at the cafe.

One is Amano Vivere's standard cup of cappuccino (\$3.30 for a small), which sounds simple by today's standards but stands out as one of the best offerings on the menu. With a milk foam that never seems to disappear until it hits the bottom, the delectable espresso goes down smooth with a hint of sweetness thanks to a light dusting of chocolate on top.

For those looking for something truly sweet, though, the caramel drizzle grandma's cookie bar (\$1.50) comes highly recommended thanks in large part to the thin caramel drizzle on top that finds a way to taste light and sweet rather than thick and goopy.

And for those of the glutenfree persuasion, the cafe offers a chocolate-mint muffin (\$3.85) that captures the flavor of and Andes Creme de Menthe treats in an incredibly moist muffin.

"These are total fan favorites," O'Malley said of the items.

And while O'Malley plans to continue rapidly changing the menu - with items like pumpkin spice- and s'mores-flavored items on the way - customers should not worry about their old favorites disappearing. O'Malley said she will keep the ingredients on hand, so popular selections should never fully disappear.

Like most good cooks, O'Malley said the secret ingredient at Amano Vivere is love.
