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Summary

The National Citizen Survey™ (The NCS™) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. This report discusses differences in opinion of survey respondents by quadrant.

Responses in the following tables show only the proportion of respondents giving a certain answer; for example, the percent of respondents who rated the quality of life as “excellent” or “good,” or the percent of respondents who attended a public meeting more than once a month. ANOVA and chi-square tests of significance were applied to these comparisons of survey questions. A “p-value” of 0.05 or less indicates that there is less than a 5% probability that differences observed between Districts are due to chance; or in other words, a greater than 95% probability that the differences observed are “real.” Where differences were statistically significant, they have been shaded grey.

The margin of error for this report is generally no greater than plus or minus three percentage points around any given percent reported for the entire sample (898 completed surveys). For each quadrant of the Village (Northwest, Northeast, Southeast or Southwest), the margin of error rises to approximately plus or minus seven percentage points since sample sizes were approximately 204 for the Northwest quadrant, 231 for the Northeast quadrant, 245 for the Southeast quadrant, 218 for the Southwest quadrant. Notable differences between quadrants included the following:

- Residents in the Southwest gave higher ratings for their neighborhoods and Orland Park as a place to retire. Conversely, residents in the Northwest gave lower ratings to their neighborhoods. Residents in the Northwest and Northeast also gave lower ratings to Orland Park as a place to retire. When asked whether they plan on remaining in Orland Park over the next five years, residents in the Northeast were the most likely to stay and residents in the Southeast were the least likely to stay.
- Participants in the Northeast rated the overall economic health of Orland Park as one of the most important areas to focus on in the next two years. Similarly, when asked about the job Orland Park does at being proactive and responsible for growth and development residents in the Southwest gave the highest ratings and the Northwest gave lower ratings. Ratings for Economy in the pillars of Participation and Community Characteristics varied among quadrants.
- Participants in the Southwest and Southeast have an easier time getting places than those in the Northwest and Northeast. And while residents in the Southwest gave the lowest ratings for the availability of paths and walking trails, they also gave the highest ratings for sidewalk maintenance. Participants in the Southwest were also more likely to use public transportation, while participants in the Northeast were the least likely to use public transportation.
- When asked about quality of Village sponsored events, 3 out of 4 quadrants rated these events highly (Northwest gave the lowest ratings). Those who were most likely to attend a Village sponsored event included participants in the Northwest and Northeast; those in the Southeast were least likely to attend. Participants were also asked what services should be priorities for the Village over the next five years; participants in the Northwest and Southeast indicated that expanding and enhancing cultural programs should be an essential or very important priority.
- General Governance ratings were higher in the Southwest and lower in the Northwest and Northeast. Participants in the Southwest rated the Built Environment as one of the most important facets to focus on in the next two years. While residents in the Southeast thought making annual investments in facilities and equipment for police and public works should be a high priority over the next five years.
