Equipment

- **Assistive Technology Exchange Network (ATEN)**— located in the Arthur & Mary Rubloff Building in Tinley Park, Illinois, ATEN recycles computers and other technology that has been donated by corporations and individuals to benefit learners with disabilities. Created in 1995, the program has distributed nearly 20,000 complete computer systems. This equipment is being donated, free of charge, to learners in public schools in 1052 schools in 516 cities throughout the state of Illinois. From September 2002 to June 2003, ATEN
