Town Hall Meeting - Video Gaming



Considerations

- In 2009, the Orland Park Board of Trustees drafted and approved an ordinance to prohibit video gaming within the corporate limits of the village.
- The board is reviewing the current video gaming ordinance and the impact it has had on Orland Park restaurants potentially losing business to communities that allow video gaming.
- The Village of Orland Park has a number of untapped home rule revenue sources, including video gaming tax.



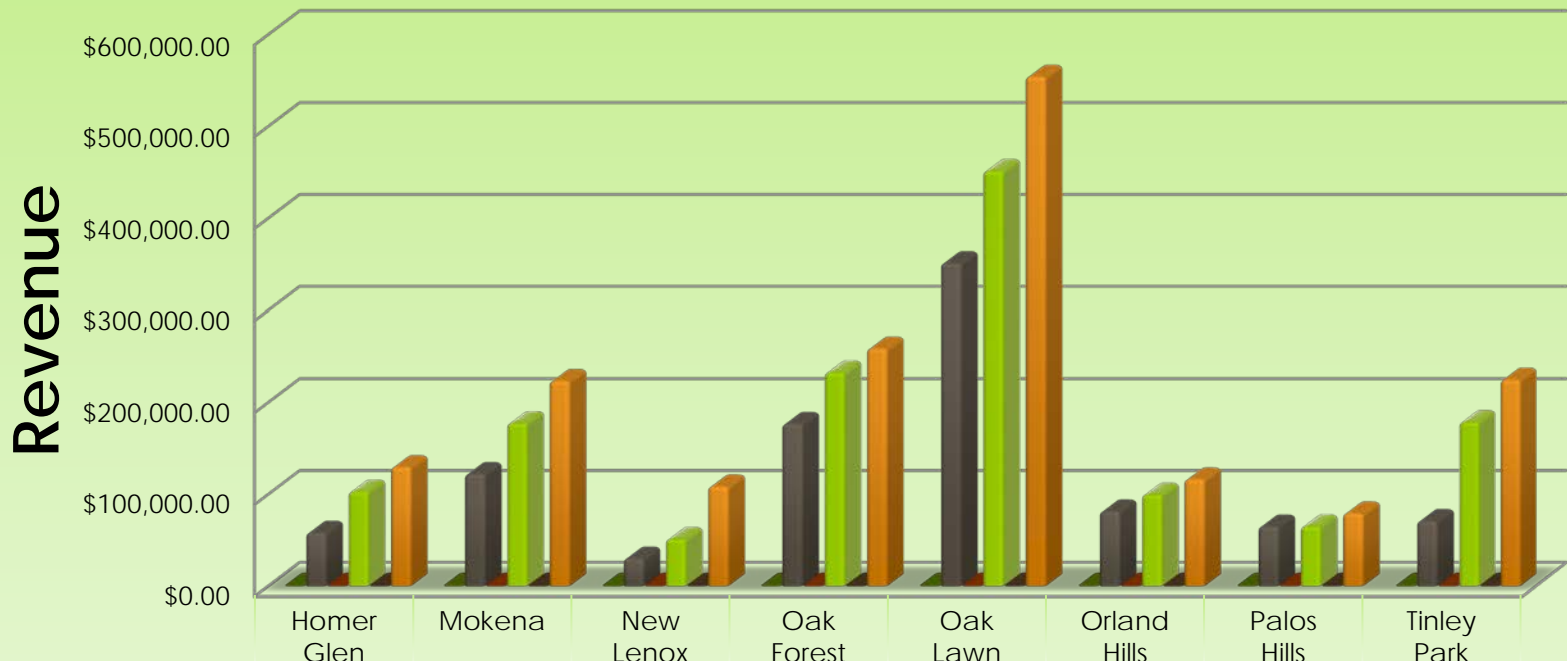
Highlights of Economic Impact Study

- Study prepared by Crowe Horwath LLP
- Analyzed video gaming revenue data of six (6) municipalities with comparable median per capita income
- Utilized Implan economic modeling software to analyze direct, indirect and induced impact in terms of employment, employee compensation, value added and output - \$9,265,563
- Estimated annual revenue - \$2,768 per terminal (\$2,268 gaming tax, \$500 terminal license fee)
- Estimated tax revenue - \$415,135



Nearby Communities Revenues

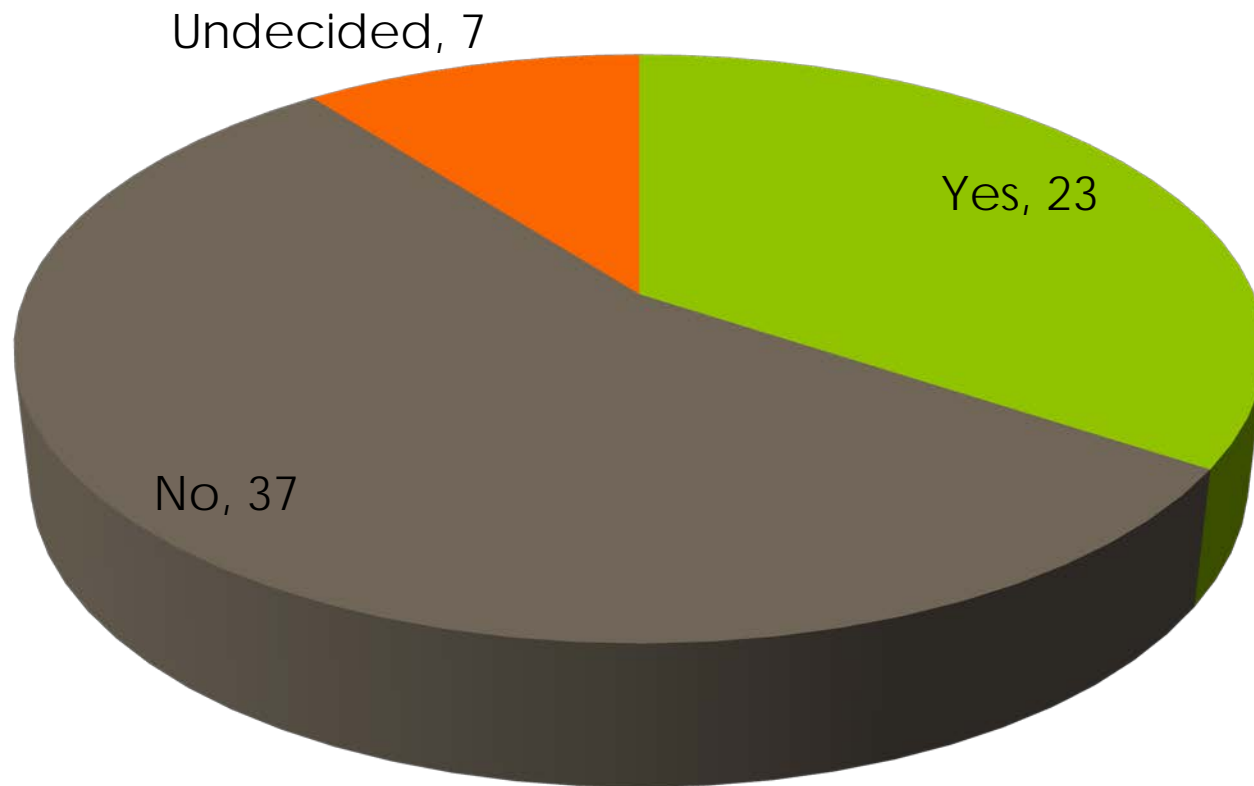

Class A Liquor License Survey





Potential Village Restrictions Include:

- Limiting to established Class A liquor license holders (full service restaurants that have kitchens and full food menus).
- Limiting signage
- Establishing physical barriers for gaming areas inside establishments
- Limiting noise and lights from gaming machines
- Village warning sticker on all entrances that announce that Video Gaming is on the Premises
- Waiting periods for new businesses
- Requiring alarms and video surveillance of areas
