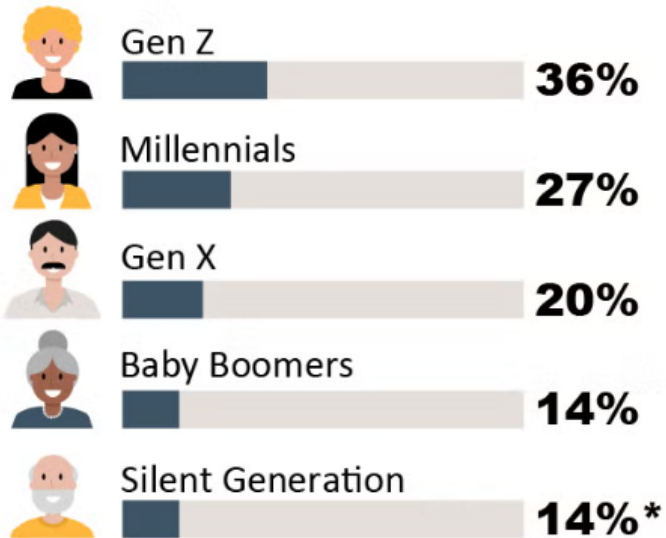

The Need

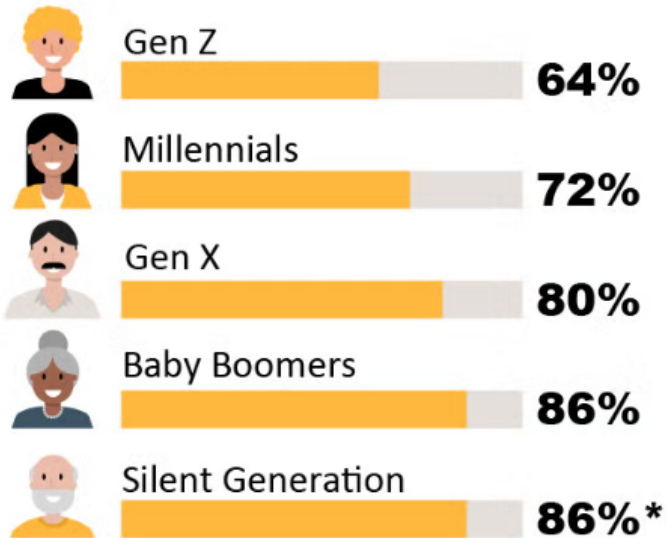
Mental Health by Generation

CARE SOLACE

Cost & Recommendation

- Cost for the service is \$1/resident/year (approx. \$58,000)
- Offset by opioid settlement funds
 - To date, the Village has received over \$64,000
 - Anticipate approximately \$87,000 over the next 13 years
 - Grants could further offset the cost
- Seek Cost-Sharing IGA with township, library, fire district, D135

Recommendation: In 2025, begin a three-year trial period.
