

## Exhibit A

### Amendments to Orland Park Village Code

I. Chapter 18, titled “Gaming Devices”, is added to Title 7, and said Title 7 is amended by the inclusion of the following language:

#### 7-18-1: Authority and Legislative Purpose.

(A) This Chapter is promulgated pursuant to the authority to prohibit video gaming in the Village of Orland Park as contained in 230 Illinois Compiled Statutes 40/27, all as may be amended from time to time. It shall be known, and may be cited, as the *ORLAND PARK VIDEO GAMING PROHIBITION ORDINANCE*.

(B) The Village President and Board of Trustees have found, as expressed in Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_, that legalized video poker would present a variety of adverse impacts on residents of the Village including the potential for corruption, impact on the costs of law enforcement, regulatory difficulties and high social costs and have further found that the legalization of video poker within the Village is not consistent with the desire to maintain a family-friendly environment for citizens and their children.

#### 7-18-2: Definitions

(A) “Video Gaming” means the ownership, placement, maintenance, operation or use of a video gaming terminal in a public place or in a fraternal or veterans’ establishment within the Village of Orland Park.

(B) “Video Gaming Terminal” means any electronic video game machine that, upon insertion of cash, is available to play or simulate the play of a video game, including but not limited to video poker, line up and blackjack, as authorized by the Board utilizing a video display and microprocessors in which the player may receive free games or credits that can be redeemed for cash. The term does not include a machine that directly dispenses coins, cash or tokens or is for amusement purposes only.

#### 7-18-3: Prohibition

(A) Video gaming is prohibited in the Village of Orland Park.

(B) A video gaming license issued by the State of Illinois is not effective within the Village of Orland Park.

(C) A prohibited video gaming terminal shall be immediately removed by the owner or operator from the public place, fraternal establishment or veteran’s establishment.

#### 7-18-4: Enforcement

Inspection. Authorized representatives of the Village Police Department, including sworn peace officers and other individuals as the Chief of the Village Police Department may designate from time to time, may make inspections of the premises of operators licensed or required to be licensed under Chapter 6 of this Code or any premises where there is cause to believe video gaming occurs, for the purpose of determining a violation of the prohibitions of this Chapter. These inspection rights are in addition to any other statutory or common law powers of the Village Police Department.

#### 7-18-5: Penalties

Any person who violates any provision of this Chapter or Chapter 6 of this Title 7 shall be subject to prosecution under the gambling provisions of the Illinois Criminal Code, 720 ILCS 5/28-1, et seq.

II. Chapter 6 of this Title 7 is amended by the addition of the following language at the end of the second paragraph of Section 7-6-1:

“Notwithstanding contrary provisions of this paragraph, video gaming devices licensed by the State of Illinois shall be considered gambling and are prohibited as provided in Chapter 18 of this Title 7.”

III. Said Section 7-6-1 is hereby further amended by the addition of the following language at the end of the existing definition of “Automatic Amusement Device”:

“Automatic Amusement Device” does not include a video gaming terminal as defined in the Illinois Video Gaming Act (230 ILCS 40/5) and Chapter 18, Title 7 of this Code.”

Chapter 6 of this Title 7 is further amended by the addition of the following language to Section 7-6-5:

“Authorized representatives of the Orland Park Police Department, including sworn peace officers and other individuals as the Chief of the Orland Park Police Department may designate from time to time, may, in the course of their inspections hereunder, also inspect for the presence of video gaming terminals prohibited under Chapter 18, Title 7 of this Code.”
