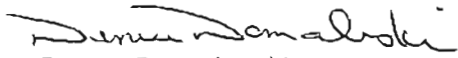

This Contract is made this 10th day of September, 2018 by and between **The Village of Orland Park** (hereinafter referred to as the "VILLAGE") and **City Roasters-Chicago** (hereinafter referred to as the "VENDOR").

WITNESSETH

In consideration of the promises and covenants made herein by the VILLAGE and the VENDOR (hereinafter referred to collectively as the "PARTIES"), the PARTIES agree as follows:

SECTION 1: THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS: This Contract shall include the following documents (hereinafter referred to as the "CONTRACT DOCUMENTS") however this Contract takes precedence and controls over any contrary provision in any of the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. The Contract, including the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, expresses the entire agreement between the PARTIES and where it modifies, adds to or deletes provisions in other CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, the Contract's provisions shall prevail. Provisions in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS unmodified by this Contract shall be in full force and effect in their unaltered condition.

SECTION 2: SCOPE OF THE WORK AND PAYMENT: The VENDOR agrees to provide labor, equipment and materials necessary to provide the services as described in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS and further described below:

**Re: 143rd Street (143rd St. & Southwest Highway) and 153rd Street (10401 W. 153rd St.)
Metra Station Concession Services**

Vendor shall furnish and maintain, at its own cost and expense, in good, usable condition, a sufficient amount of equipment and supplies in order to carry out the activities and operation of its concession services and shall maintain such equipment in a clean, orderly and inviting condition satisfactory to the Village. Vendor shall maintain the concession area and all personal property located therein in a clean, neat, orderly, and safe condition, including all fixtures for customer's convenience, and including without limitation, collection and proper disposition of trash in receptacles.

NOTE: Any alterations to the existing space must be pre-approved by the Village and shall be at the sole responsibility and expense of the Vendor. All improvements shall become

property of the Village upon expiration/termination of this contract.

Operations

The Vendor shall operate the concession stand at minimum from 5:00A.M. to 8:30A.M., Monday through Friday, except holidays. Any change to hours of operation during the term of the agreement must be approved by the Village. Once established, Vendor has permission to expand to include evening hours 4:00P.M. to 7:00 P.M. Monday through Friday.

Vendor shall have available for sale, at a minimum, the following items: non-alcoholic beverage items, pastries and personal sundries for the use of commuters.

Vendor provision of beverages and pastries shall be consistently high in quality and shall at all times be sanitary, orderly and sufficient to meet public demand. Village of Orland Park Health Department standards must be met.

Vendor shall not sell or permit to be sold, used or brought upon the licensed locations under Vendor's control any intoxicating or alcoholic beverages.

Vendor shall employ and train, at vendor's own cost and expense, a sufficient number of qualified personnel, and agrees that the services provided by such personnel to the public shall be provided in a courteous, businesslike and efficient manner.

Areas of Maintenance and Sanitation – The Vendor will be responsible for the maintenance and sanitation of the concession facilities and the surrounding areas.

Sales Reports – The Vendor shall maintain and provide sales reports to the Village on a monthly basis. They can be emailed to Ahmad Zayyad at azayyad@orlandpark.org and/or Denise Domalewski at ddomalewski@orlandpark.org.

(hereinafter referred to as the "WORK").

Village Responsibilities:

The facilities are equipped with water, and electric and natural gas hookups and shall be free to the vendor. The Village will provide access to restrooms, trash receptacles and the cost of scavenger service. Any phone service shall be at the Vendor's expense.

SECTION 3: ASSIGNMENT: VENDOR shall not assign the duties and obligations involved in the performance of the WORK which is the subject matter of this Contract without the written consent of the VILLAGE.

SECTION 4: TERM OF THE CONTRACT: This Contract shall commence on the date of its execution. The WORK shall commence upon a Notice to Proceed and continue expeditiously until either the Village or the Vendor has given proper notice of its desire to terminate this contract; however, it may be terminated by either of the PARTIES for default upon failure to cure after ten (10) days prior written notice of said default from the aggrieved PARTY. Either PARTY, for its convenience, may terminate this Contract with ninety (90) days prior written notice. All improvements shall become property of the Village upon expiration/termination of this contract.

SECTION 5: INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE: The VENDOR shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the VILLAGE, its trustees, officers, directors, agents, employees and representatives and assigns, from lawsuits, actions, costs (including attorneys' fees), claims or liability of any character, incurred due to the alleged negligence of the VENDOR, brought because of any injuries or damages received or sustained by any person, persons or property on account of any act or omission, neglect or misconduct of said VENDOR, its officers, agents and/or employees arising out of, or in performance of any of the provisions of the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, including any claims or amounts recovered for any infringements of patent, trademark or copyright; or from any claims or amounts arising or recovered under the "Worker's Compensation Act" or any other law, ordinance, order or decree. In connection with any such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities, the VILLAGE, its trustees, officers, directors, agents, employees, representatives and their assigns shall have the right to defense counsel of their choice. The VENDOR shall be solely liable for all costs of such defense and for all expenses, fees, judgments, settlements and all other costs arising out of such claims, lawsuits, actions or liabilities.

The Vendor shall not make any settlement or compromise of a lawsuit or claim, or fail to pursue any available avenue of appeal of any adverse judgment, without the approval of the Village and any other indemnified party. The Village or any other indemnified party, in its or their sole discretion, shall have the option of being represented by its or their own counsel. If this option is exercised, then the Vendor shall promptly reimburse the Village or other indemnified party, upon written demand, for any expenses, including but not limited to court costs, reasonable attorneys' and witnesses' fees and other expenses of litigation incurred by the Village or other indemnified party in connection therewith.

Execution of this Contract by the VILLAGE is contingent upon receipt of Insurance Certificates provided by the VENDOR in compliance with the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

SECTION 6: COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: VENDOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, statutes, rules and regulations including but not limited to the Illinois Human Rights Act as follows: VENDOR hereby agrees that this contract shall be performed in compliance with all requirements of the Illinois Human Rights Act, 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq., and that the VENDOR and its subcontractors shall not engage in any prohibited form of discrimination in employment as defined in that Act and shall maintain a sexual harassment policy as the Act requires. The VENDOR shall maintain, and require that its subcontractors maintain, policies of equal employment opportunity which shall prohibit discrimination against any employee or applicant for employment on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, ancestry, citizenship status, age, marital status, physical or mental disability unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the essential functions of the job, association with a person with a disability, or unfavorable discharge from military service. VENDOR and all subcontractors shall comply with all requirements of the Act and of the Rules of the Illinois Department of Human Rights with regard to posting information on employees' rights under the Act. VENDOR and all subcontractors shall place appropriate statements identifying their companies as equal opportunity employers in all advertisements for workers to be employed in work to be performed under this contract.

The VENDOR shall obtain all necessary local and state licenses and/or permits that may be required for performance of the WORK and provide those licenses to the VILLAGE prior to commencement of the WORK.

SECTION 8: STANDARD OF SERVICE: Services shall be rendered to the highest professional standards to meet or exceed those standards met by others providing the same or similar services in the Chicagoland area. Sufficient competent personnel shall be provided who with supervision shall complete the services required within the time allowed for performance. The VENDOR'S personnel shall, at all times present a neat appearance and shall be trained to handle all contact with Village residents or Village employees in a respectful manner. 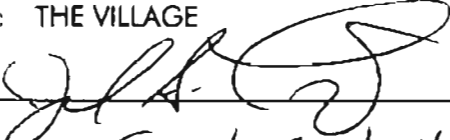
SECTION 11: LAW AND VENUE: The laws of the State of Illinois shall govern this Contract and venue for legal disputes shall be Cook County, Illinois.

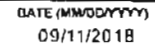

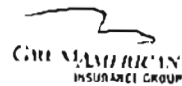

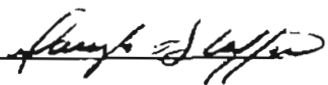

Hold Harmless Agreement

To the fullest extent permitted by law, The City Roasters LLC ("vendor") shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless THE VILLAGE OF ORLAND PARK, its related entities, their respective officers, directors, employees and agents ("Indemnitees"), from and against all claims, damages, losses, costs, expenses, judgments and liabilities (including but not limited to attorney's fees, costs and expenses) that may be asserted against or incurred by any of them due to: (a) any real or personal property damage relating to Vendor's occupancy of the Indemnitees' property or any portion thereof, or Vendor's participation in the Event; (b) any accident or injury (including but not limited to personal injury and bodily injury) to any persons (including Vendor's employees), sickness, disease or death, or to injury or destruction of tangible personal property, including the loss of use thereof, caused by or in connection with: (i) the performance of any services or the furnishing of any goods, materials, food, beverages or other property upon the Indemnitees' property by Vendor; or (ii) any negligent act or omission of the Vendor, its employees, contractors or subcontractors, anyone directly or indirectly employed by them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, unless the same is caused solely by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnitees; and/or (c) any claim, ruling, and/or decision by any local state and/or federal agency or court that the Indemnitees must pay any tax or any kind because of a ruling that Vendor and/or its employees are employees of the Indemnitees, all regardless of whether or not any such claim, damage, loss, cost, expense, judgment or liability it is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder.

If Vendor suffers any claims, damages or losses caused by any person or entity engaged by or through or for the benefit of the Indemnitees or any other person or entity, Vendor shall not hold or seek to hold the Indemnitees responsible therefore, but rather, Vendor shall proceed solely against such person or entity causing such claim, damage or loss.

In the event such indemnity as described above is prohibited by law, then said indemnity shall only be to the extent caused by the negligent acts or omissions of the Vendor, its agents and employees, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, or to the greatest extent allowed by law.
